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### SAN DIEGO, 2001, HANAIEI HOTEL

Its almost that time again, 2001 reunion. We are going to be at the Hanalei Hotel in San Diego, California. Meals and tours have been arranged, final touches are being made on the hats and coffee mugs, the "Give-away" has been ordered, we are once again on the fast track as August approaches. Our fourth annual reunion will be hosted by the **Hanalei Hotel** in San Diego, California. As always, we refused to settle for less than the best. The Hanalei is a beautiful facility. It's clean, the rooms are spacious and include all the extra's that will ensure you a pleasant and comfortable stay. Their courteous and professional staff is eager to provide us with a memorable reunion.

This will be our fourth reunion and frankly, I had reservations about going to the west coast. It took much negotiation, but we have managed to receive a special group room rate of \$109.00 per night for the reunion. This rate is good for rooms during the reunion along with reservations up to 3 days before and 3 days after for those who wish to come early or stay late. The dates for the 2001 reunion are from Wednesday August 8, through Sunday, August 12. The Cut-Off date for all hotel reservations, tours and other reservations is July 1st.

**Reservations:** All hotel and tour reservations after the cutoff date will be limited to a first come, first served basis. Reservations made after the cutoff dates will be subject to limited availability. Remember, we have a very liberal cancellation policy. Better to reserve and cancel than to miss out on an activity.

**2001 Reunion Prices:** Our need for a first class hotel means we have to pay a few dollars more. We spent considerable time in San Diego trying to find the best location possible at a reasonable rate. The increase in room rate this year is due primarily to the location. San Diego, and in fact, California, in general is a very expensive place to hold our reunion. However, our group has members in virtually every state and it is only fitting that we accomodate our west coast shipmates. This year's tour prices are again fairly low due, in part, to the fact that we planned the tours without including meals as part of the cost. Overall, I believe that the prices are very reasonable.

The address of the **Hanalei Hotel** is 2270 Hotel Circle North, San Diego, CA 92108. It's located in Mission Valley, in the heart of San Diego just east of the Interstate 5 and 8 interchange. Currently, shuttle service from the airport is available from Cloud 9 Shuttle at a cost of \$7.00 per person.

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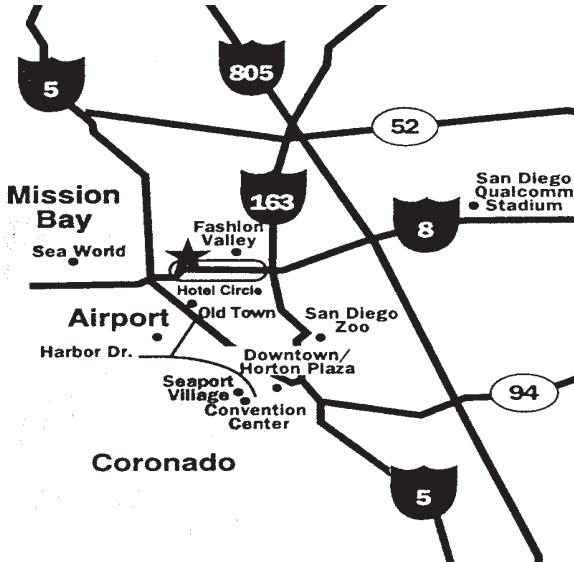

## DIRECTIONS TO THE HOTEL

The Hanalai hotel is located in the Hotel Circle area of San Diego's Mission Valley. If you are arriving by air at the San Diego Airport, then you should use one of the Airport Shuttles. Cloud 9 Shuttle Service is available for \$7.00 per person (remember that these rates are based upon information available at this time). Cloud 9 provides shuttle service 24 hours per day. After claiming your luggage, follow the signs to the Ground Transportation Skybridge. Proceed to the "Shuttle for Hire" curb and ask the Transportation Coordinator for Cloud 9 Shuttle.

For those of you who plan to drive to the hotel: from Interstate 8, take the Hotel Circle exit towards Taylor Street, then turn right onto Hotel Circle N. From Interstate 5, go east on Interstate 8.

## ENERGY SURCHARGE

As I was making the final changes to this newsletter, I received a letter from the Sales Manager at the Hanalei Hotel. As most of you might know, the state of California has been dealing with a serious energy crisis for several months now. The increased price of gas and electricity has had a dramatic effect on the hotel industry.

Effective March 2, 2001, the hotel is implementing an "Energy Surcharge" of \$3.00 per room, per night. This surcharge is temporary and is necessary in order to continue to provide us with the quality accommodations that we insist on for our reunions.

I have talked with several other reunion organizers and we have concluded that while the room rate is guaranteed, this surcharge, over and above the room rate, is within the guidelines specified in our contract. As I am sure most of you realize, taxes and other charges are not normally included as the basic room rate. This surcharge, while minimal, must be taken into consideration when making your plans for the 2001 reunion.

It is my hope that, by the time August, 2001, comes, this situation will have resolved itself and the surcharge will be removed. I did want to let you know that it may be in effect when you make your reservations. The Hanalei is a first rate, quality hotel. Considering the concessions that they have made in order to make our reunion affordable, I feel that the surcharge, while unfortunate, is a small price to pay in order to ensure a memorable reunion for all.

If the status is "RNP" then your 2001 dues are not paid and this newsletter is your Registration Newsletter that you receive in the event you want to attend the 2001 Reunion in San Diego. For those members not current with their dues, this is the last newsletter that you will receive until the 2002 Registration Newsletter is mailed in March, 2002.

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## MEMBERSHIP DIRECTORY

The 2001 Membership Directory is included with this newsletter for all dues paying members. If your dues are current and you did not receive a directory, please let me know. The address label on the envelope should say "RP" if your 2001 dues are paid.

The directory was compiled from information in my files up to March 14, 2001. Please check the information in the directory and make sure that it is correct. If you find any errors, let me know and I will correct the files as soon as I receive the information.

## REMEMBER THE DEADLINE

When you read the reservation forms, keep in mind that there are deadlines for all reservations. The deadline to receive the Association Group Rate of \$109.00 at the hotel is **July 1, 2001**. These rates are good for room reservations from three days prior to, until three days following the reunion. After the July 1 cutoff date, the hotel is under no obligation to honor this rate. In both 1999 and 2000 we had late arrivals with no reservations who ended up paying the going rate for their room (more than twice the group rate). Please make your reservations directly with the hotel early.

There is also a deadline for tours and meals. I must receive your registration form and check prior to **July 1, 2001** in order to complete the reservations for the tours and meals with the tour company and hotel. Any registrations received after the cutoff date will be subject to availability.

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## TOURING SAN DIEGO

The Hanalei Hotel lies at the west end of Mission Valley, close to San Diego's major roads and highways. The hotel is within minutes of all major attractions in San Diego County.

Adjacent to the Hotel is the Riverwalk. It is a splendid environmental experience along the San Diego River, you'll see striking varieties of trees and flowers and enjoy the feel of a park within a city. Your stroll will also take you past the green area of the Riverwalk Golf Club, a challenging 27 holes of golf open to the public,

Just five minutes west of the Hanalei is Mission Bay, whose 27 miles of shoreline is free to the public and provides a wealth of recreational opportunities for visitors and residents alike. One of the most popular attractions on Mission Bay is Sea World Aquatic Park, home to Shamu and friends. Only five minutes west of Mission Bay begins the beaches for which San Diego is so famous,

Belmont Park in South Mission Beach is home to the Giant Dipper, the largest historic wooden roller coaster in Southern California. The park also has many other carnival type rides, an arcade and eateries. Enjoy the rides, food and fun then relax with a beautiful sunset on the adjoining beach.

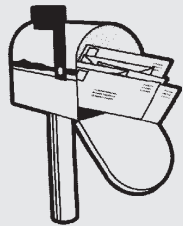
Ten minutes south of the Hanalei is the Embarcadero on San Diego Bay, Harbor Cruises by several companies, the Maritime Museum, Seaport Village and the colorful waterfront are among this area's popular diversions.

Two minutes southwest of the hotel is Old Town Historic Park with buildings representative of the city's early years. Surrounded by the ambiance of Old Mexico, you can appreciate a bit of history, or shop and dine on authentic Mexican and American cuisine. Distinctive restaurants, a special atmosphere, interesting merchandise, and the cordiality of the service people combine to make Old Town one of the city's chief attractions.

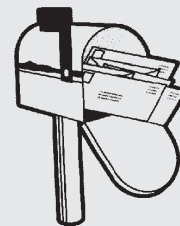
World famous San Diego Zoo is located ten minutes directly south of the hotel in Balboa Park. The Park, a 1,400 acre refuge in the center of the city, is noted for its tranquil atmosphere, museums and galleries. Veterans Memorial Center in Balboa Park honors the memories of all the men and women who have served in the Armed Forces of the United States. The San Diego Peace Memorial, erected in 1969, dedicated to veterans who died in Vietnam can also be found in the Park.

Just ten minutes from the Hanalei is the Cabrillo National Monument, which commemorates Cabrillo's 1542 exploration of the New World. The monument lies on Point Loma on the western edge of San Diego Bay.

Ten minutes east of the Hanalei is Qualcomm Stadium, home of two professional sports teams, the Padres baseball team and the Chargers football team.

Twelve minutes from the Hotel, at the east end of Mission Valley, three blocks up from the trolley, is Mission San Diego, with its beautiful sanctuary and gardens, it ranks high on the list of places to see. From anywhere you are in Mission Valley, you can find this serene and lovely escape from a hectic life.

Fashion Valley, one of San Diego's finest shopping malls is two minutes from the hotel. The center features large department stores such as Nordstrom, Neiman-Marcus, Macy's and JCPenny as well as many specialty stores, shops and restaurants

Three minutes east of Fashion Valley is Mission Valley Center. Along with many specialty shops, there are Robinsons-May, Loehmann's and another Macy's. Also in the Center is the AMC20 Movie Theatre, the largest theatre complex in San Diego.

La Jolla, fifteen minutes northwest, is a city renowned for its chic boutiques, a shoppers paradise. If shopping is not your thing, you must see the Stephen J. Birch Aquarium - Museum and the Scripps Institute of Oceanography. Both are beautifully designed and a wealth of information.

Horton Plaza, ten minutes south of the hotel in Downtown San Diego, offers a wide range of shops and eateries in an urban "village" atmosphere reminiscent of an Italian hill town.

Shops, sights and restaurants fill a 16 block area of Downtown known as The Gaslamp District. This historical district houses some of the best dining San Diego has to offer. There are also a variety of nightclubs to suit everyone from jazz to Top 40 to salsa or reggae.

Within a reasonable distance of the Hanalei Hotel are other popular sights and attractions. San Diego Wild Animal Park, 35 minutes north of the hotel, is a satellite operation of the Zoo, and noted for its innovative outdoor natural habitats which have enabled the successful reproduction of many endangered species.

There are many tours for seeing San Diego. The Old Town Trolley will pick you up in front of the hotel (ask the desk for the day's schedule). After exploring the Old Town area, climb aboard your trolley for a day's activities of seeing and hearing about some of the

interesting sights of the city. You can get off for a look and maybe even lunch at any one of the many beautiful locations at which the Trolley stops. Get back on the next available trolley to see Balboa Park. There are several stops in the Park, including the world famous Zoo, but watch the time as you need to catch a trolley back to Old Town for a Margarita before coming back to the hotel.

Harbor Excursions offers daily harbor tours leaving from Broadway Pier in Downtown as well as a ferry over to the Coronado Marketplace. A 2 1/2 hour dinner cruise is also available in the evening which includes a 3 course meal, dancing and a spectacular view of the San Diego skyline.

Be sure to stop by the Concierge / Bell Desk and ask about all of the different tours available. The staff will be more than happy to help plan your free time.

San Diego is a golfer's paradise! With over 70 scenic and challenging courses to choose from, a golfer could spend forever here and never be bored! In addition to the adjacent Riverwalk Golf Club there are many courses within twenty minutes of the Hanalei.

San Diego is served by a Metropolitan Transit System (Trolley). This newly completed light-rail trolley line into Mission Valley now delivers visitors to Old Town, the Downtown Convention Center, east through La Mesa to the Santee area and south to the Mexican border via clean and affordable public transportation.
