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### CHICAGO 2002, SHERATON NORTHWEST, ARLINGTON PARK HOTEL

Well, here we are again, the 2002 reunion is fast approaching. It seems that each year should be easier to arrange, but Chicago has been difficult from the beginning. To start with, my site inspection trip to the "Windy City" was delayed until after the arrival of the newest member of the McManuels family. My first Grandchild, Samantha Jade McManuels made her appearance on October 3, 2001.

Contract negotiations with the hotel were completed on February 28, 2002. We are going to be at the Sheraton Chicago Northwest Hotel in Chicago, Illinois. Meals and tours have been arranged, final touches are being made on the hats and coffee mugs, the "Give-away" has been ordered, we are once again on the fast track as August approaches. As always, we refused to settle for less than the best. The Sheraton is a clean and well staffed hotel. The rooms are spacious and include all the extra's that will ensure you a pleasant and comfortable stay. Their courteous and professional staff is eager to provide us with a memorable reunion.

This will be our fifth reunion. Last year, I had reservations about going to the West Coast. Of particular concern was the fact that the room rate at the Hanalei was \$109.00 per night. It will please you to know that the room rate for the 2002 reunion will be \$91.00 per night for a standard room. The rate for a Club Level Suite is \$121.00. These rates are good for rooms during the reunion along with reservations up to 3 days before and 3 days after for those who wish to come early or stay late. The dates for the 2002 reunion are from Wednesday August 21, through Sunday, August 25. The Cut-Off date for all hotel reservations, tours and other events is July 1st.

**Reservations:** All hotel and tour reservations after the cutoff date will be limited to a first come, first served basis. Reservations made after the cutoff dates will be subject to limited availability. Remember, we have a very liberal cancellation policy. Better to reserve and cancel than to miss out on an activity.

**2002 Reunion Prices:** Those who have attended our reunions in the past realize that we need a first class hotel, so naturally we sometimes have to pay a few dollars more. During

my site inspection in Chicago I visited several hotels. We could have gotten a lower rate at other hotels and then paid for meeting space, we can pay more for the rooms and less for the meals, or vice versa. I believe we have negotiated the best contract possible.

**Meal Prices:** You will note that the Friday buffet is being listed as an Outdoor Bar-B-Que. The Sheraton Northwest has an outdoor facility that will be tented and should provide a unique setting for our Friday night festivities. I had serious reservations about the idea when the sale staff presented it to me, however, once I worked out menu options and prices, it seemed like a great idea. This year we are planning to have entertainment following the Friday Backyard Bar-B-Que too. I am certain you will enjoy yourselves.

**Tours:** As always we will have tours set up for your entertainment and relaxation. This year's tour prices are again fairly low. Like last year, all meals during the tours will be "On Your Own". The number of seats available for tours will be limited to one coach, so get your reservation package in early. Remember that we still must meet the minimum number of seats filled in order to avoid any penalties. I like to include tours in order to make your reunion more enjoyable for all. Overall, I believe that the tour prices are very reasonable.

**Business Meeting:** Our Business Meeting, this year, will be held on Saturday morning. Members and wives are encouraged to attend. Schedule and location will be posted in the Hospitality Room I promise to make it shorter this year so that we can get on with the Saturday Tour.

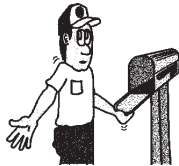
## REUNION SURVEY!

tions are required. Please call 1-800-244-6200 at least 24 hours in advance. To make arrangements, have the number of people, the exact arrival time; airline and flight number available. Always give our group name (Patrol Gunboat Association) to expedite the reservation. Rates will be quoted at that time.

The Sheraton Chicago Northwest has 429 beautifully appointed, newly renovated rooms including 24 suites. Amenities include the "Sheraton Sleigh Beds" in every room, coffee maker, hair dryer, iron and ironing board, writing desk, data ports, Voice Mail, on-demand movies and Nintendo (for all those kids at heart).

The hotel has two Club Floors with much larger rooms, high speed internet access, extra amenities and a Lounge. You can upgrade your room to the Club Level when you make your reservation if you like.

The Sheraton Northwest has four restaurants. There is a new Starbucks, Delaney & Murphy Steak House (rated #1 Steak House in Chicago's Northwest Suburbs by Zagat's), the Brasserie for casual dining, and Trophies Bar and Grill.

You will find a business center for faxing, copying and computer



needs. There is also a full Health Club with complete Universal equipment, sauna, whirlpool and Olympic size indoor pool. This amenity is complimentary for hotel guests. Massage therapy is available for a small charge. Personal trainers are also available with an appointment at an additional charge. The hotel also offers complimentary tennis, basketball, sand volleyball, and horseshoes.

The hotel offers free parking for 1,200 cars. It is located near the METRA Train Station, which goes directly to Downtown quickly, and easily at a minimal cost. The Sheraton provides complimentary transportation to and from the station for your convenience. This is an ideal way for you to go into the city, and still take advantage of the attractions and low rates a suburban property can offer.

The Sheraton Chicago Northwest is adjacent to the Arlington International Racetrack (A Churchill Downs corporation offering the finest in Thoroughbred racing), and the hotel will provide free transportation to and from the track as well. The cost is minimal; a \$5.00 entrance fee. (Racing Season is June – October, and they have a great restaurant called TrackSide.

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## THE COST OF KIDS

The government recently calculated the cost of raising a child from birth to 18 and came up with \$160,140 for a middle income family. Talk about sticker shock! That doesn't even touch college tuition. But \$160,140 isn't so bad if you break it down.

It translates into \$8,896.66 a year, \$741.38 a month, or \$171.08 a

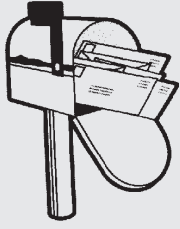
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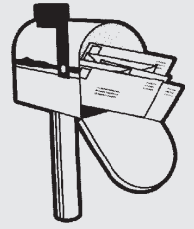
## ROOM UPGRADE DRAWING FOR EARLY RESERVATIONS
