VALLEY FORGE, 2003 SHERATON PARK RIDGE HOTEL

Time flies, doesn't it. The 2003 reunion is just around the corner. Finally, things seem to be getting easier. I'm not certain that I am getting better, I think that this reunion was easier to plan due to just plain luck. The hotel, as well as the Valley Forge Convention and Visitors Bureau, really made it easy for us to set this one up.

We visited Valley Forge last year and looked at several properties. Ironically, the Park Ridge was a last minute stop, we were actually on our way home from the Site Inspection trip when the CVB suggested that we check out this one last hotel. No question about it, the Park Ridge was one of the nicest hotels we had looked at during our stay. To make it even better, they had the best package for our group. On June 11, 2002, we signed the contract for our 2003 Reunion. The dates for the reunion are **August 20 - August 24, 2003**. The group rate is \$78.00, single, double, triple, quad. Meals and tours have been arranged and we are working on the final touches for the hats and coffee mugs. I have ordered the free "Giveaway" for each attendee and it looks like this will be the best reunion so far. As always, we would only accept a clean and well staffed hotel. The Sheraton is one of the nicest hotels I have seen. The rooms are spacious and include all the extras that will ensure you a pleasant and comfortable stay. Their courteous and professional staff is eager to provide us with a memorable reunion.

This will be our sixth reunion. I was quite pleased last year to be able to arrange a group room rate at less than \$100.00, this year the rate at the hotel will be \$78.00, single, double, triple or quad. These rates are good for rooms during the reunion along with reservations 2 days before and 2 days after for those who wish to come early or stay late. The Cut-Off Date for all hotel reservations, tours and other events is July 6th.

Reservations: All hotel and tour reservations after the Cut-Off Date will be limited to a first come, first serve basis. Reservations made after the Cut-Off date will be subject to limited availability. Remember, we have a very liberal cancellation policy. Better to reserve and cancel than to miss out on an activity.

2003 Reunion Prices: Those who have attended our reunions in the past realize that we need a first class hotel, so naturally we sometimes have to pay a few dollars more. During my site inspection of Valley Forge, I visited several hotels. The Park Ridge basically matched the rate from every other hotel we looked at. Short of staying at an Econo Lodge or Comfort Inn, I doubt that we could have gotten a lower rate at any hotel. No question about it, I believe we have negotiated the best contract possible.

Meal Prices: Last year, in an attempt to save some money on the Buffet Dinner, we tried an Outdoor Bar-B-Que on Friday night. I learned my lesson, we will be going back to our standard Friday Buffet Dinner this year. I also tried to save us a few dollars by having the hotel bring in our refreshments from the Hospitality Room last year, instead of using a cash

bar. Again, I learned my lesson. Your complaints have been heard and I have gone back to a cash bar on Friday night. This year we will again entertain ourselves following the buffet dinner, and, by the way, suggestions for this entertainment are always welcome.

Events and Tours: I think that one of the benefits of these reunions is the opportunity to see what the area has to offer. America is a beautiful country, with lots to see and do. This year we start off with a free wine and cheese reception on Wednesday evening. This reception is being provided by the hotel at no charge to the Association. As always, I have arranged tours for your entertainment and relaxation. Most of this year's tour prices are fairly low. Tours make the reunion more enjoyable and overall, I believe that the tour prices are very reasonable. Remember, we still must meet a minimum in order to avoid any penalties.

Thursday, we will spend the day in **Lancaster County**. The Amish have inhabited this area for more than 250 years. They live today much like their forefathers who came to Pennsylvania to escape religious persecution. Enjoy a tour of the **Back Country**, with a stop to visit an **Old Order Amish home and quilt shop**. Enjoy lunch at the **Good 'N' Plenty Restaurant** for a meal you will never forget. Prior to returning to the hotel, we will stop to browse at the **Kitchen Kettle Shopping Village** and the charming shops in the town of Intercourse, PA.

Friday we will visit **Historic Philadelphia and Valley Forge National Park**. Our day will begin with exploring "America's Most Historic Square Mile". We will walk in the footsteps of our Founding Fathers. We will see **Carpenter's Hall, Independence Hall and Congress Hall**; the **Liberty Bell, Christ Church and the Betsy Ross House**. Following lunch on your own at the **Reading Terminal Market**, we will travel the **Benjamin Franklin Parkway** with a brief stop in front

of the **Philadelphia Museum** at the famous "Rocky" stairs for the best view of the Philadelphia skyline. Next stop, **Valley Forge National Park**. No other place associated with the American Revolution symbolizes the suffering, sacrifice and ultimate triumph of the citizen soldier than Valley Forge. To conclude the day, a brief visit to the beautiful **Washington Memorial Chapel**, built to honor Washington and his men.

GOOD ADVICE

I pass this along for your information, author unknown.

The next time you order checks have only your initials (instead of first name) and last name put on them. If someone takes your check book they will not know if you sign your checks with just your initials or your first name but your bank will know how you sign your checks. Put your work phone # on your checks instead of your home phone. If you have a PO Box use that instead of your home address. If you do not have a PO Box use your work address. Never have your Social Security Number printed on your checks, you can add it if necessary. Remember, if you have it printed on the check, anyone can get it.

Place the contents of your wallet on a photocopy machine, do both sides of each license, credit card, etc. You will know what you had in your wallet and all of the account numbers and phone numbers to call and cancel. Keep the photocopy in a safe place. Also carry a photocopy of your passport when you travel either here or abroad.

We've all heard horror stories about fraud that's committed on us in stealing a name, address, Social Security Number, credit cards, etc. Unfortunately I have firsthand knowledge because my wallet was stolen last month. Within a week, the thief(s) ordered an expensive monthly cell phone package, applied for a VISA credit card, had a credit line approved to buy a Gateway computer, received a PIN number from DMV to change my driving record information on-line, and more.

But here's some critical information to limit the damage in case this happens to you or someone you know:

We have been told we should cancel our credit cards immediately. But the key is having the toll free numbers and your card numbers handy so you know whom to call. Keep those where you can find them easily.

File a police report immediately in the jurisdiction where it was stolen, this proves to credit providers you were diligent, and is a first step toward an investigation (if there ever is one).

But here's what is perhaps most important: (I never even thought to do this). Call the three national credit reporting organizations immediately to place a fraud alert on your name and Social Security number. I had never heard of doing that until advised by a bank that called to tell me an application for credit was made over the Internet in my name. The alert means any company that checks your credit knows your information was stolen and they have to contact you by phone to authorize new credit.

By the time I was advised to do this, almost two weeks after the theft, all the damage had been done. There are records of all the credit checks initiated by the thieves' purchases, none of which I knew about before placing the alert. Since then, no additional damage has been done, and the thieves threw my wallet away this weekend (someone turned it in). It seems to have stopped them in their tracks.

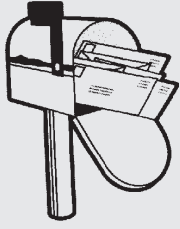

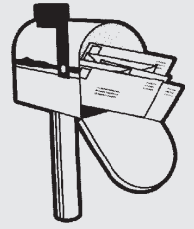

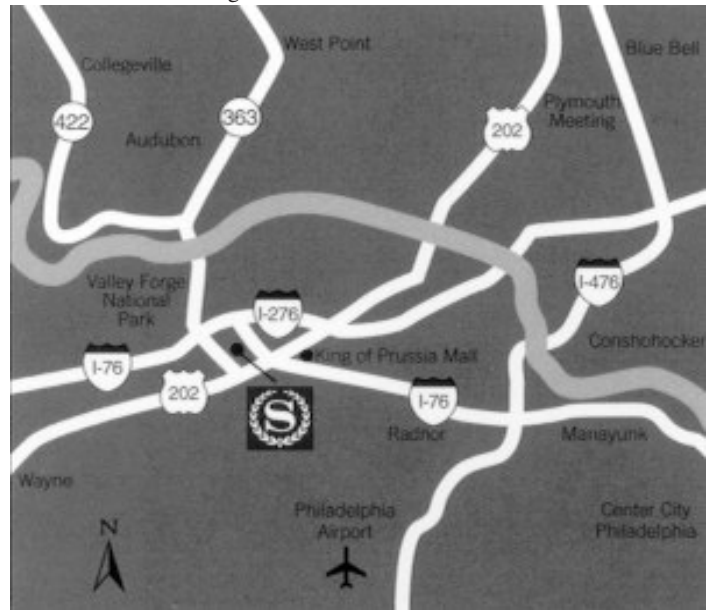


I am sure everyone is tired of hearing about the survey sheets every year. When I sign the contracts, I must guarantee the room block over a year in advance. There are also two opportunities to review the room block prior to the actual reunion, and this is where I use the results of the survey. The better the response to the survey, the closer I can estimate the actual room block requirement and the less chance that we will fail to meet these requirements. It is essential that I know what to expect when I sign contracts and when we review our needs. The contract that I sign each year states specifically how much the hotel expects to make on every function along with exact minimums and the penalties for failure to meet these minimums.

The bottom line this year is actually found in the middle of page 5 of the contract. It states that the hotel will realize a minimum of \$25,250.00 in revenue from our reunion (don't worry Mac's, but bring your checkbook just in case). Your assistance with the surveys just makes things so much easier.

DIRECTIONS TO THE HOTEL

The Sheraton Park Ridge from **Philadelphia International Airport:** Follow I-95 South to Exit 7 (476 North/Plymouth Meeting). Follow 476 North to Exit 16B (76 West). Follow 76 West to Exit 327 (Mall Boulevard). Turn right onto Mall Boulevard, at next light, turn right onto Gulph Road. Hotel is 1 mile ahead on the right.



From Pennsylvania Turnpike: Follow the Pennsylvania Turnpike to Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Immediately following the toll, take Valley Forge Exit 327. Hotel is 1/2 mile ahead on the right.

From I-76 (Schuylkill Expressway): Follow I-76 (Schuylkill Expressway) to Exit 327 (Mall Boulevard). Turn right onto Mall Boulevard, at next light, turn right onto Gulph Road. Hotel is 1 mile ahead on the right.

Secured parking is free at the Sheraton Park Ridge Hotel. Once you arrive you should be able to leave your car in the lot since the hotel provides complimentary shuttle service to many places of interest.
