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CONCORD, CA - 2004 HOLIDAY INN CONCORD

WOW! Can you believe it, the 2004 reunion is rapidly approaching. I am pleased to say that things are finally getting easier. Either that, or I am definitely getting better at this. Of course, the fact that the Concord Convention and Visitors Bureau did quite a bit of the work on the hotel selection certainly helped too. The fact is that the Concord CVB and the hotel really made it easy for us to set this one up.

We visited California in February, 2003. Our goal was to arrange a San Francisco reunion that was both high quality and reasonably priced. Unfortunately, very few things are reasonably priced in San Francisco. Then I received a call from the Concord, CA Convention and Visitors Bureau and the rest is history. Our site inspection trip included visits to six hotels in the city of Concord during our four day trip.

I mention this every year, but for the benefit of our new members I will say it again. We can obviously find a very inexpensive hotel to host our reunions. The drawback to going to a Comfort Inn or a Days Inn is that we would not have meeting space, hospitality rooms or banquet dinner facilities. These things require us to hold our reunion at a convention style hotel. The cost is a bit more, but I assure you that I do my best to locate a hotel that will give you the most for your reunion dollar. California is simply a very expensive place to go and the San Francisco area is at the top of the price list. That is why I am so excited with the reunion package we put together for 2004. In March, 2003, we signed the contract with the Holiday Inn Concord for our 2004 Reunion. The dates for the reunion are **August 04 - August 08, 2004**. The group rate is \$83.00 per night, single, double, triple, quad. Meals and tours have been finalized and we are now working on the hats and coffee mugs. I have ordered the free "Giveaway" for each attendee and it looks like this will again be a great reunion. The Holiday Inn Concord is a clean and well staffed hotel. The spacious rooms include all the extras that will ensure you a pleasant and comfortable stay. The Holiday Inn has a courteous and professional staff who is very eager to provide us with a memorable reunion.

This will be reunion number 7 and as always I am very excited to once again visit with friends and shipmates from the Gunboats. The rates at the hotel are good for rooms during the reunion along with reservations 3 days before and 3 days after for those who wish to come early or stay late. The Cut-Off Date for all hotel reservations, tours and other events is June 20th.

Reservations: All hotel and tour reservations after the Cut-Off Date will be limited to a first come, first serve basis. Reservations made after the Cut-Off date will be subject to limited availability. Remember, we have a very liberal cancellation policy. Better to reserve and cancel than to miss out on an activity.

2004 Reunion Prices: Those who have attended our reunions in the past realize that we need a first class hotel, so naturally we sometimes have to pay a few dollars more. During our site visit to Concord, we visited several hotels. The Holiday Inn in Concord matched or beat the rate from

every other hotel we looked at. Short of staying at an Econo Lodge or Comfort Inn, I doubt that we could have gotten a lower rate at any hotel.

Meal Prices: This year we will again follow our same basic agenda. Wednesday and Thursday meals are on your own. Friday we will have a buffet dinner and as always, Saturday will be our banquet. This year we will again entertain ourselves following the buffet dinner, and, by the way, suggestions for this entertainment are always welcome. Live entertainment is planned following the banquet.

Events and Tours: Our hospitality room will open at noon on Wednesday with registration until 7:00 PM. There will be a free wine and cheese reception on Wednesday evening from 6:00 until 8:00. This reception is being provided by the hotel at no charge to the Association. As always, I have arranged tours for your entertainment and relaxation. Most of this year's tour prices are fairly low. Tours make the reunion more enjoyable and overall, I believe that the tour prices are very reasonable. Remember, we still must meet a minimum in order to avoid any penalties.

Thursday, we will take a narrated sight-seeing tour of the city of San Francisco. Our driving tour will include the Financial District, Marina District, Nob Hill, Civic Center, Palace of Fine Arts, Presidio, Golden Gate Bridge, Cliff House and Golden Gate Park. Our coach will then take us to lunch "On your own". Seafood lovers will be able to spend a couple of hours at Fisherman's Wharf to enjoy lunch and free time to see the sights. If you prefer, you can remain on the coach and go to China Town instead. Our coach will depart China Town at 3:15, pick up the folks at Fisherman's Wharf and return to our hotel at 4:30. Thursday evening, dinner is "On Your Own".

Friday will be our day to enjoy California Wine Country. We are going to travel into the Heart of the Napa Valley, arriving via Highway 29. Our

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first stop, V. Suttui at 10:30 to tour the winery. Of course, wine tasting will be in order, along with having time to browse the cheese deli. Next, we head to Yountville for lunch "On Your Own" among the many quaint shops and eateries. Next stop, St. Supery where you will enjoy the Victorian Atkins House, Barrel Room and Gallery. At 3:15 we will leave Napa Valley and head back to our hotel by way of the Silverado Trail, arriving at 4:30. The bar will open at 6:00 with our buffet dinner starting at 7:00.

Saturday, time to go back to sea. Our coaches will depart the hotel at 11:30 and arrive at the USS Hornet at 12:30. Remember that great navy chow, relax and enjoy fine dining with a box lunch that will make you think you are back in Uncle Sam's Canoe Club once again. Then spend several hours touring the USS Hornet (sorry, no sea pay, I already checked that out).

Business Meeting: Our Business Meeting, this year, will be held on Saturday morning. Members and wives are encouraged to attend. Schedule and location will be posted in the Hospitality Room. I will do my best to make this meeting short, but I feel it is important to take the time to keep you informed on how our Association is doing. I will also provide information on the 2005 Reunion at the Business Meeting.

BALL CAPS & COFFEE MUGS

Once again we will have ball caps and coffee mugs available at the reunion. The shipment of ball caps and coffee mugs will be sent directly to the hotel and will be available during registration. Ball caps will be given to those shipmates who purchase \$20.00 in raffle tickets for the Saturday Night Raffle Drawing. Commemorative Coffee Mugs will be given to each crewmember during registration. I will have a limited number of extra mugs for sale at the Reunion for those who want more than one. The remaining hats and mugs will be available for sale on a first come, first serve basis after the Reunion. We will also bring along a limited selection of previous years caps and mugs for those who wish to complete their collections.

PRE-SORT MAIL FOR NEWSLETTERS

We now use a presorted mail permit for our newsletters which helps reduce our costs for postage. In case you are not familiar with using a presorted mail permit, we basically get to mail our newsletter for about twenty eight cents when we sort the mailing by zip code in advance. There is a minimum of 250 pieces required and an annual fee of \$150.00, but in the long run we will save a good bit of money this way. The reason I am telling you this is that if you don't get your dues in on time, then your newsletter will be going out after the regular mailing, and the cost to mail it will be regular first class postage.

FREE BREAKFAST DRAWING FOR EARLY RESERVATIONS

All shipmates that have both their Hotel and Event Reservations in by no later than **May 15, 2004** will be eligible for a special drawing. The winner will receive a certificate good for breakfast for two at the "Cafe Bravo" restaurant. This certificate will be good for breakfast at any time during the reunion compliments of the Holiday Inn Concord. Remember, all of your reservations, including your hotel reservations must be made prior to the May 15 drawing.

2004 DUES STATUS

Back when we held our first business meeting in Peoria, we voted on Association Membership Dues. The membership present at that first reunion decided to set dues at \$20.00, and we have continued to collect this amount ever since.

Dues are used primarily for costs associated with running the Association. Our biggest expense is the cost of printing and mailing the Gunboat Riders newsletter. Copies of the newsletter go out to all dues paying members each quarter. Right now we have mailing addresses on 938 people. As agreed when we formed the Association in 1998, all dues paying members receive copies of Gunboat Riders as well as a membership directory each year. Members who chose not to pay dues receive the special pre reunion edition newsletters only.

Your dues status is usually printed on the mailing label sent with the newsletters. To determine your dues status, check the label on the envelope that this newsletter came in.

Name and address information is on the left side of the label. On the top right side of the label is your member status for 2004. If there is an "RP" next to your status, then your 2004 dues are paid. If there is an "RNP" or "RNPI", then your 2004 dues are not paid.

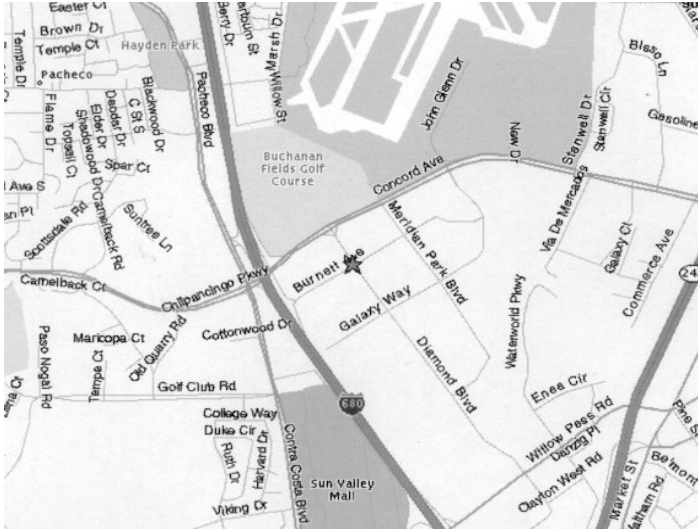
The sample label indicates that the member has paid their 2004 dues. If you had not paid your 2004 dues, then the status would indicate "RNP". If the status is "RNPI", then you are a member in your first year, and your dues are not paid. If you have decided not to pay Association dues, then this will be the last edition of Gunboat Riders you will receive until the next special edition. Honorary and Associate members are also exempt from paying dues but do not receive the Membership Directory. DIRECTIONS TO THE HOTEL

The Holiday Inn Concord is located at 1050 Burnett Avenue in Concord, Ca. If you are coming from the East, from I-80 West, you would merge onto I-680 South toward Benicia/ San Jose. Take the exit toward Concord / Pacheco. Then turn left onto Contra Costa Boulevard. You then turn left onto Concord Avenue, then make a slight right onto Diamond Boulevard. Next you turn right onto Burnett Avenue, the hotel is at 1050 Burnett Avenue.

Coming from the South on I-680, you take the Burnett Avenue



exit toward Concord Avenue. Next, take a slight right onto Burnett Avenue and the hotel is at 1050 Burnett Avenue.

2004 50/50 Drawing

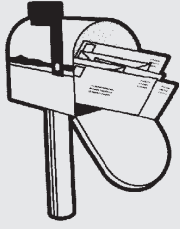

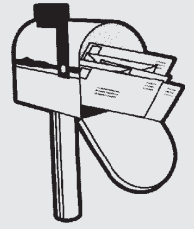

You might wonder why I don't guarantee more rooms when I do the contract. Well, to put it simply, if we fail to fill the room block that we sign for, we have to pay for the rooms if the hotel doesn't sell them. If we exceed the room block, then we only lose a few perks since most of the concessions we receive are based on the total number of rooms guaranteed in the contract. Finally, we review the room block six months prior to the reunion and make changes. I increased the original block from 50 rooms on peak (Saturday) night to 60. Based on the survey we should have 52 rooms filled on Saturday, and I added an additional eight to be safe. The hotel has apparently now taken reservations for many of the remaining rooms. It is so essential that I know what to expect when I sign contracts and when we review our needs. I simply cannot emphasize how important the annual surveys are when it comes to planning the reunions.
